Legal basis for data processing

The legal basis for data processing is Article 6(1)(1)(b) GDPR (fulfilment of a contract).

Recipients of the data

Access to the data is restricted to university employees who necessarily require it to perform their assigned tasks in the organization of the Winter School.

Your rights

Affected persons have the right to obtain information from the ones responsible about their personal data and to have incorrect data corrected or deleted, provided one of the reasons listed in Article 17 GDPR applies, such as when the data is no longer needed for the purposes pursued. Additionally, there is the right to restrict processing if one of the conditions mentioned in Article 18 GDPR applies and in cases under Article 20 GDPR, the right to data portability. If data is processed based on Article 6(1)(1)(e) GDPR (data processing for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority vested in the controller) or (f) GDPR (data processing for the purposes of legitimate interests), the data subject has the right to object to the processing at any time for reasons arising from their particular situation. In such a case, we will no longer process the personal data unless we can demonstrate compelling legitimate grounds for the processing that

override the interests, rights, and freedoms of the person, or the processing serves the establishment, exercise, or defense of legal claims.

Right to file a complaint with a supervisory authority.
